NATIONAL CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK

Technology has advanced to another level altogether and to achieve sustainable development & create more opportunities for students by allowing them to learn & sharpen their skill sets, transforming the education system is crucial. National Education Policy(2020) serves a clear roadmap for achieving excellence, innovation & quality education in the Indian educational system.

Accordingly, we too have made the following modification in our Curriculum -

- Compulsory coding learning and other skill development for classes VI to XII
- Co-scholastic Activities will be done on a regular basis, focusing on overall development of the children
- Examination will be conducted semester wise in the preparatory, middle & secondary classes and month wise in the foundation stage.
- Learning will be more experiential
- Internal Assessment will be done regularly to help our student to perform better and at the same time Teacher's too can mark their progress
- Students of classes IX to XII will be offered multiple subjects, from which they can choose the best suitable ones.
- More emphasis will be put on critical thinking of the students, clearing their conceptual knowledge
- Presently two Indian Languages till class VIII and one Indian language till class XII will be taught compulsorily

The overarching agenda behind these provisions is to ensure that every student has equal opportunities to access quality education, regardless of their socioeconomic status or geographic location.

বারোয়ারি কথা



বাঙালির বারো মাসে তেরো পার্বন। সবেমাত্র শেষ হল বাঙালির প্রধান উৎসব দুর্গাপুজো। তোমরা নিশ্চয়ই বারোয়ারি পুজোর কথা শুনেছ? সবাই মিলে চাঁদা তুলে সকলের জন্য যে পুজোর আয়োজন, তাকেই বলে বারোয়ারি পুজো। এখনকার বেশিরভাগ পুজোই তাই। কিন্তু জানো কী, এই বারোয়ারি পজোর শুরু কিভাবে হয়েছিল?

বহু যুগ আগে কেবল ধনী, বনেদি পরিবারেই দুর্গাপুজো হত। জাঁকজমক করে এই পুজোর আয়োজন হলেও তাতে সাধারণ মানুষের প্রবেশধিকার ছিল না। একবার হুগলির গুপ্তিপাড়ায় এরকমই এক জমিদারবাড়িতে দুর্গাপুজো দেখতে গিয়েছিল স্থানীয় গরিব গ্রামবাসীরা। কিন্তু তাদের পুজোবাড়িতে ঢুকতে দেওয়ার বদলে অপমান করে তাড়িয়ে দেওয়া হয়। গ্রামবাসীদের এই অপমান দেখে এগিয়ে আসেন সেই গ্রামেরই বারো জন ব্রাহ্মণ বন্ধু। তাঁরা স্থির করেন, প্রতিবেশীদের থেকে চাঁদা তুলে সকলের জন্য পুজোর আয়োজন করবেন। কিন্তু ততদিনে দুর্গাপুজো শেষের পথে। সামনে রয়েছে জগদ্ধাত্রী পুজো। আর জগদ্ধাত্রী তো মা দুর্গারই আরেক রূপ। তাই ঠিক হল, সমস্ত নিয়ম মেনে চাঁদা তুলে এই জগদ্ধাত্রী পুজোই করা হবে সকলের জন্য। আজ থেকে প্রায় ২৭০ বছর আগে হুগলির গুপ্তিপাড়ায় আয়োজিত এই জগদ্ধাত্রী পুজোই ছিল বাংলার প্রথম বারোয়ারি পুজো। বারো জন 'ইয়ার' বা বন্ধু মিলে এই পুজো করেছিল বলে এর নাম হয় 'বারো ইয়ারি' বা 'বারোয়ারি' পুজো।

পরবর্তীকালে ধীরে ধীরে হুগলির চন্দননগর ও নদিয়ার কৃষ্ণনগরেও সাধারন মানুষের জন্য বারোয়ারি জগদ্ধাত্রী পুজোর প্রচলন হয়। এরও প্রায় ১৫০ বছর পরে কলকাতার ভবানীপুরে সনাতন ধর্মৎসাহিনী সভার পক্ষ থেকে প্রথম বারোয়ারি দুর্গাপুজোর আয়োজন করা হয়। এই পুজো আজও হয়ে আসছে। বর্তমানে কলকাতায় দুই হাজারেরও বেশি বারোয়ারি পুজো হয়। তবে, 'বারোয়ারি'-র বদলে 'সর্বজনীন' শব্দটিই এখন বেশি প্রচলিত।

Should school children be loved or disciplined by the teachers?

Every schoolteacher would perhaps like to get a quick-fix solution for their dilemma about whether a child should be treated with love (with a fear

looming large about the possibility of the child being spoilt) or should he be treated with strictness as a measure for disciplining him (while remembering that the 'rod' has been outlawed!)

Frankly, as a teacher, I don't have that guick fix; but I believe that an ideal teacher will focus on discipline with love and not with fear. However, while loving school children, a teacher must remember that rules and limits should be set beforehand so that school children clearly know their limits. There is no point punishing a child after he has committed something that he did not know was out-ofbounds for him and, also, no point showering love on him for breaking discipline.

A teacher must realise that frequent frowns may frustrate youngsters. To approach with a smile takes care of a lot of things. The students are in our care – not in penal custody. And, hence, this balance between discipline, teaching and love is so important to be understood. Teachers have to remember not to offend the children. Their problems should be patiently heard so that they can openly speak. Communication skill is the key and it can minimize misunderstandings.

Children should be given responsibilities to perform. This can help pupils be disciplined and at the same time get motivated and develop interests in various activities. In case the child commits a mistake, while recognising the error, the teacher should give logical answers regarding the consequences they might face. Also, the teacher must use the error as a learning experience for the child. Discipline will not come by force but by making students realise logically. Being a teacher, I believe that open communication and two-way communication can help students to be disciplined. Love can be the way out to collaborate with them and make them understand why discipline can be significant.



- 4.Cosmetics




